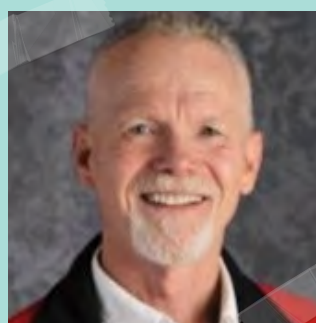

Leadership can take on many faces. Sometimes it looks like 6th graders **taking charge** of raising and lowering the flag over their campus each day. It may be a kindergartner **leading** memory verse recitation in the classroom, a second grader leading the pledges for the American and Christian flags or fourth graders collecting the offering during chapel. It might even be a student **leading Bible prayer time** in class, listening to others' requests and then praying for them. Leadership can also be seen on the playground as classmates gather around an injured friend and one leads prayer for comfort and healing. Faith Christian offers students many opportunities throughout the day to develop and **demonstrate leadership skills**. As students get older, these opportunities carry more and more responsibility with them.

On the secondary campus, leadership may look like the elected student council members who **plan and develop** activities for the student body, including working through all the details to carry it out as well as **supervising and directing** other students who help. It may be the athlete wearing the Faith Christian uniform who is challenged to **lead by example** and represent the school and Christ both on and off the court, field or course.

It could also be the Bible student who is taught that being a Christian means **setting an example for others** to follow and who participates in the yearly holiday meal for the homeless because **servant leadership** is highly valued. Or, it may be the student who represents Faith Christian on the **Teen Leadership Council** at the hospital or at the **Boys State leadership program**. It could also be the student in the hallway between classes who notices the need of a classmate and steps in to meet it.



It's no surprise that students who attend Faith Christian **demonstrate leadership** in caring for one another, **setting a Godly example, serving others, taking on responsibilities, and getting things done**. Administrators, teachers and coaches at Faith Christian consistently challenge students to think about what it means to be a leader and they give students **responsibilities** that help them to grow and develop these **leadership skills**. The world will be a better place because of our students. Together we are training and influencing the **leaders of tomorrow** right here at Faith Christian!
